- Duke does have a Faulty/Draft condition report that is available when problems are found due to a gas leak or CO level is high. Contact Duke if you have questions. A copy of the report is attached.

HCCC – Jason Dunn

• Hamilton County budget was approved. Part of the budget was a utility tax that would be assed to Duke, GCWW, Cin Bell and Time Warner to assist with the cost of the HCCC service and lower the dispatch rate. It may take till June before the tax will go into effect. There is a referendum to challenge the tax on January 13th and 20th. A memo will come out soon to explain the taxing process. If the tax is assessed our dispatch fee would be reduced by 30% from \$20.95 to somewhere between \$10 and \$13 per detail

- Mobilecomm will be out after the first of the year to reprogram radios.
- The CAD is now set to go live on Jan 26th.
- HCCC is looking at replacing the Communicator with a new program called Hyper Reach. They are working with EMA with that program.

GC Hazmat – Brook Matzen, Chief Ober

- They have had 26 responses thus far this year 13 in Hamilton County.
- Using active 911 for receiving their dispatches.

Homeland Security/EMA - Nick Crossley

- Examining the reverse 911 system
- New budget allows for EMA to hire some new employees and offer more training
- Developing a new threat/risk matrix
- Will add new Board members after the first of the year
- The "Credentialing" system memo sent out by ODPS to allow private-sector personnel to enter an emergency scene for assistance is being examined.
