GLOSSARY:

Where possible; the terminology contained herein, mirrors that of the National Incident Management System (NIMS). For the purposes of this publication, modifications to official NIMS terminology or the addition of terms outside the official National Incident Management System's official glossary are identified by the "★" symbol.

A

Aerial Fire Apparatus (NFPA 1901) A vehicle equipped with an aerial ladder, elevating platform, aerial ladder platform or water tower that is designed and equipped to support fire fighting and rescue operations by positioning personnel, handling materials and providing continuous egress or discharging water at positions elevated from the ground. Where possible, the authors of this publication have classified aerial apparatus into one of the following types: Ladder, Platform or Tower. ★

Aerial Platform – a self supporting, turntable mounted device consisting of a personnel-carrying platform attached to the uppermost boom of a series of power-operated booms that articulate, telescope or both and are sometimes arranged to provide the continuous egress capabilities of an aerial ladder.

Advanced Life Support (ALS) Ambulance [Ground] – An ambulance service capable of delivering advanced skills performed by Emergency Medical Services (EMS) practitioners (e.g., intravenous [IV] fluids and drug administration).

Agency: A division of government with a specific function offering a particular kind of assistance. In ICS, agencies are defined either as jurisdictional (having statutory responsibility for incident management) or as assisting or cooperating (providing resources or other assistance).

Air Truck (NFPA 1901) A vehicle used to supply breathing air either to refill self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) or to supply respirators directly through hose lines. ★

Air Conditioner/Heater – A specialized climate controlled piece of equipment used to support cooling and/or heating requirements with enclosed structures. Requires mobilization to the desired site, along with set up requirements such as power hook-up and duct insulation. Amps can range from 24 to 260 or more.

Apparatus [Fire] – (NFPA 1901) – a vehicle designed to be used under emergency conditions to transport personnel and equipment and to support the suppression of fires and mitigation of other hazardous situations. ★

B

Basic Life Support (BLS) Ambulance (Ground) – An ambulance service capable of delivering basic emergency interventions performed by Emergency Medical Services (EMS) practitioners trained and credentialed to do so (e.g., splinting, bandaging, oxygen administration).

Bomb Squad/Explosives Teams - a police or fire unit specializing in the investigation and disarming of suspected explosive devices. ★

Boat (Fire) – A vessel or watercraft designed and constructed for the purpose of fighting fires providing specified level of pumping capacity. Fire boats are designed with the ability to carry fire-fighting foam and personnel for the extinguishment of fires in the marine environment.

Boat (Rescue) – A vessel or watercraft designed and constructed for the purpose of affecting a rescue. ★

Breathing Air System (NFPA 1901) – The complete assembly of equipment such as compressors, a purification system, pressure regulators, safety devices, manifolds, air tanks or receivers and interconnected piping required to deliver breathing air. For the purposes of this publication, breathing air systems may be identified as "Support Units" or Cascade Systems" ★

B (continued)

Brush Patrol Unit/Firefighting Brush Patrol- (denoted as “Brush” units for this particular publication). Brush trucks generally have off-road capabilities for traversing rough terrain in order to reach the fire. *

C

Cascade System (NFPA 1901) – A method of piping air tanks together to allow air to be supplied to the SCBA fill station using a progressive selection of tanks each with a higher pressure level. *

Chillers and Air Handlers – a portable system that produces cold water through a series of components. When equipped with an air handler, cold air is generated and distributed. Requires mobilization to the desired site along with setup requirements such as power hookup, water connections and duct installation. (Example: fan/water misting units). Defined as “Heating” or “Cooling” units for the purpose of this publication. *

Command and communications apparatus (NFPA 1901) – a fire apparatus used primarily for communications and incident command. *

Crew Transport Vehicles – Any vehicle capable of transporting a specified number of crew personnel in a specified manner. For the purpose of this publication, crew transport vehicles are designated as either “Staff Vehicles/Cars”, “Bikes” or “Gators.” *

D

Decontamination (Apparatus/Equipment/Vehicles) [see also Mass Decontamination Vehicles] – the physical or chemical process of reducing and preventing the spread of contaminants from persons and equipment used at a hazardous materials (Haz Mat) incident. NFPA Standard # 472. For the purposes of this manual, the terms “Decontamination” and “Mass Decontamination” are distinguished by the number of individuals the device/apparatus is designed to decontaminate in an hour. For

the purposes of this publication “Decontamination Apparatus/Equipment/Vehicles” refer to staffed equipment/apparatus with the capacity to decontaminate < (less than) 200 individuals per hour. “Mass Decontamination Units” are further distinguished as specialized apparatus capable of decontaminating 200 or more individuals /hour. *

Dispatch - The ordered movement of a resource or resources to an assigned operational mission or an administrative move from one location to another.

E

Engine (Pumper)– Any ground vehicle providing specified levels of pumping, water, hose capacity and staffed with a minimum number of personnel (for the purposes of this publication, engine companies are denoted by the terms “Engine and/or Pumper.”)

Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs): The physical location at which the coordination of information and resources to support domestic incident management activities normally takes place. An EOC may be a temporary facility or may be located in a more central or permanently established facility, perhaps at a higher level of organization within a jurisdiction. EOCs may be organized by major functional disciplines (e.g., fire, law enforcement, and medical services), by jurisdiction (e.g., Federal, State, regional, county, city, tribal), or some combination thereof.

Equipment: Instrumentality needed for an undertaking or to perform a service including its associated supplies. Equipment can range from small personal items such as search and rescue gear (flashlights, dusk masks, etc.) to large-scale multi-jurisdictional systems (radio repeater systems, computer networks, etc.)

Event: A planned, non-emergency activity. ICS can be used as the management system for a wide range of events, e.g., parades, concerts, or sporting events.

F

Foam: (NFPA 1901) – An aerated fire-extinguishing system, solution created by mixing air into foam solution to form bubbles. *

Foam Unit –

(Mobile Foam fire apparatus NFPA 1901) – Fire apparatus with a permanently mounted fire pump foam proportioning system and foam concentrate tank whose primary purpose is for use in the control and extinguishment of flammable and combustible liquid fires in storage tanks and other flammable liquid spills. *

Hazardous Materials Response Team –

An organized group of individuals that is trained and equipped to perform work to control actual or potential, leaks, spills, discharges, or releases of hazardous materials. The team/equipment may include external or contracted resources.

Heavy/Light Rescue – sometimes called a Rescue Company or Rescue Squad, these apparatus are primarily designed to facilitate technical rescue situations such as auto-accidents, rope rescues or building collapse. *

High Angle Rope Rescue – Type of rescue in which the load is predominately supported by the rope rescue system.

G

Generators (portable – NFPA 1901): a mechanically driven power source that can be removed from the fire apparatus and operated at a location that is remote from the fire apparatus. Diesel fueled engine generators are used to support electrical requirements at facilities of various sizes such as hospitals, housing, plants and commercial stores. Units are usually mounted on tow behind or trailer mobilized equipment.

H

Hazardous Materials – any material that is explosive, flammable, poisonous, corrosive, reactive or radioactive, or any combination thereof and requires special care in handling because of the hazards it presents to firefighters and the general public. *

Hazardous Materials Response Fire Apparatus (NFPA 1901) – An emergency vehicle designed to carry various support equipment and personnel to a scene of a hazardous materials incident. *

I

Ice Search and Rescue Team Water Rescue Team or Public Safety Dive Team – team locates and rescues individuals rapped under ice capped.

Illumination Unit (aka Lighting Unit) – A portable light generating unit capable of providing three to six lights of 500 watts each with extension cords from 500 feet to 1,000 feet to provide a specified level of illumination capacity.

Incident Management Team – a command team comprised of the Incident Commander, appropriate command and general staff personnel assigned to an incident.

In House – Assets or expertise specifically owned, possessed, directed and/or controlled by the responding agency.

J

Jurisdiction: A range or sphere of authority. Public agencies have jurisdiction at an incident related to their legal responsibilities and authority. Jurisdictional authority at an incident can be political or geographical (e.g., city, county, tribal, State, or Federal boundary lines) or functional (e.g., law enforcement, public health).

K

L

Local Government: A county, municipality, city, town, township, local public authority, school district, special district, intrastate district, council of governments (regardless of whether the council of governments is incorporated as a nonprofit corporation under State law), regional or interstate government entity, or agency or instrumentality of a local government; an Indian tribe or authorized tribal organization, or in Alaska a Native village or Alaska Regional Native Corporation; a rural community, unincorporated town or village, or other public entity. See Section 2 (10), Homeland Security Act of 2002, Pub. L. 107-296, 11

Low Angle Rope Rescue - rescue in which the load is predominately supported by itself and not the rope rescue system.

M

Major Disaster: As defined under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5122), a major disaster is any natural catastrophe (including any hurricane, tornado, storm, high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, tsunami, earthquake, volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, or drought), or, regardless of cause, any fire, flood, or explosion, in any part of the United States, which in the determination of the President causes damage of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant major disaster assistance under this Act to supplement the efforts and available resources of States, tribes, local governments, and disaster relief organizations in alleviating the damage, loss, hardship, or suffering caused thereby.

Mass Decontamination Units - are distinguished from other decontamination equipment/apparatus as response units with the capacity to decontaminate 200 or more individuals /hour. *

Mitigation: The activities designed to reduce or eliminate risks to persons or property or to lessen the actual or potential effects or consequences of an incident. Mitigation measures may be implemented prior to, during, or after an incident. Mitigation measures are often informed by lessons learned from prior incidents. Mitigation involves ongoing actions to reduce exposure to, probability of, or potential loss from hazards. Measures may include zoning and building codes, floodplain buyouts, and analysis of hazard-related data to determine where it is safe to build or locate temporary facilities. Mitigation can include efforts to educate governments, businesses, and the public on measures they can take to reduce loss and injury.

Mobilization: The process and procedures used by all organizations—Federal, State, local, and tribal—for activating, assembling, and transporting all resources that have been requested to respond to or support an incident.

Mobile Communications Center (Mobile Emergency Operations Center [EOC]) (Mobile Command Center) or Continuity of Operations Vehicles – vehicle that serves as a self sustaining mobile operations center capable of operating in an environment with little to no basic services, facilitating communications between multiple entities using an array of fixed and/or wireless communications equipment, providing appropriate work space for routine support functions, and providing basic services for personnel in short-term or long term deployments.

Multi-Agency Coordination Entity: A multi-agency coordination entity functions within a broader multi-agency coordination system. It may establish the priorities among incidents and associated resource allocations, define agency policies, and provide strategic guidance and direction to support incident management activities.

N

National Incident Management System:

A system mandated by HSPD-5 that provides a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, local, and tribal governments; the private-sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work effectively and efficiently together to prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size, or complexity. To provide for interoperability and compatibility among Federal, State, local, and tribal capabilities, the NIMS includes a core set of concepts, principles, and terminology. HSPD-5 identifies these as the ICS; multi-agency coordination systems; training; identification and management of resources (including systems for classifying types of resources); qualification and certification; and the collection, tracking, and reporting of incident information and incident resources.

O

P

Public Safety Dive Team – team that assists with location and recovery of drowning victims, evidence in criminal cases and abandoned vehicles and provides safety divers for special events.

Q

Quint – (NFPA 1901) Fire apparatus with a permanently mounted fire pump, a water tank, a storage hose area, an aerial or elevating platform with a permanently mounted waterway and a complement of ladders. ★

R

Response Plan: A plan mandated by HSPD-5 that integrates Federal domestic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery plans into one all-discipline, all-hazards plan.

Rescue (Unit/Apparatus/Equipment or Personnel) – apparatus, personnel or equipment with the ability to access, stabilize and evacuate distressed or injured individuals by whatever means necessary to ensure their timely transfer to appropriate care or to a place of safety. Where possible, (in this publication) rescue apparatus have been further categorized as either “Heavy” or “Light” rescue equipment.★

Response: Activities that address the short-term, direct effects of an incident. Response includes immediate actions to save lives, protect property, and meet basic human needs. Response also includes the execution of emergency operations plans and of mitigation activities designed to limit the loss of life, personal injury, property damage, and other unfavorable outcomes. As indicated by the situation, response activities include applying intelligence and other information to lessen the effects or consequences of an incident; increased security operations; continuing investigations into nature and source of the threat; ongoing public health and agricultural surveillance and testing processes; immunizations, isolation, or quarantine; and specific law enforcement operations aimed at preempting, interdicting, or disrupting illegal activity, and apprehending actual perpetrators and bringing them to justice.

Resources: Personnel and major items of equipment, supplies, and facilities available or potentially available for assignment to incident operations and for which status is maintained. Resources are described by kind and type and may be used in operational support or supervisory capacities at an incident or at an EOC.

R (Continued)

Resource Management: Efficient incident management requires a system for identifying available resources at all jurisdictional levels to enable timely and unimpeded response. Resource management according to NIMS, incorporates mutual-aid agreements; the use of special Federal, State, local, and tribal teams; and other highly specialized resources.

Rope Rescue (aka: High Angle Rescue, Low Angle Rescue, or Technical Rescue) – personnel appropriately equipped to affect a rescue through the use of rigging techniques, anchor systems, relays/ mechanical advantages, subject extrication techniques and low- and high-angle rescue techniques. *Where possible, the authors of this publication have attached “high angle, low angle, or technical rescue” descriptors to rope rescue assets throughout the three state, twelve-county region. **

S

Specialized Service Equipment: (NFPA 1901) – a multipurpose vehicle that provides support services at an emergency scene. For the purposes of this document Specialized Service Equipment can be found under the heading “Special Response Equipment” and includes apparatus such as: *Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) Response Units, Hazardous Materials Response/Decontamination Units, Rehabilitation Units, Heat/Cooling Units, mobile lighting equipment, Command Vehicles and Crew Transportation Equipment. **

Swift Water Search and Rescue Team (aka Flood Search and Rescue or Water Rescue Team) – team that conducts surface search and rescue operations on waterways where the water is moving fast enough to produce sufficient force to present a life and safety hazard to a person entering it.

T

Task Force (Fire/EMS/Rescue) – A team comprised of five resources or less of the same type with a supervisor and common communications capability. Whether it is five resources or less, a specific number must be identified for the team. For instance, an EMS task force might be comprised of two ALS teams and three BLS teams and a supervisor. *

Technical Assistance: Support provided to State, local, and tribal jurisdictions when they have the resources but lack the complete knowledge and skills needed to perform a required activity (such as mobile-home park design and hazardous material assessments).

Tanker/Tender (Mobile Water Supply Apparatus – NFPA 1901) – a vehicle designed primarily for transporting (pick-up, transporting and delivering) water to fire emergency scenes. *

Tender (Hose) - a vehicle designed primarily for transporting hose to fire emergency scenes. *

Type: A classification of resources in the ICS that refers to capability. Type 1 is generally considered to be more capable than Types 2, 3, or 4, respectively, because of size; power; capacity; or, in the case of incident management teams, experience and qualifications.

U

Unit: The organizational element having functional responsibility for a specific incident planning, logistics, or finance/administration activity.

V

Volunteer— A NIMS, a volunteer is any individual accepted to perform services by the lead agency, which has authority to accept volunteer services, when the individual performs services without promise, expectation, or receipt of compensation for services performed. (See 16 U.S.C. 742f(c) and 29 CFR 553.101)

W

Water Tower (NFPA 1901) —an aerial device consisting of permanently mounted power operated booms and a waterway designed to supply a large capacity mobile elevated water stream the booms can be of articulating or telescoping design.
