Good Morning,

I am unable to make this mornings meeting due to a sick child. I'll try to jump on the zoom call pending a Pediatrician appt. Below are some notes I hope are helpful. Have a wonderful day.

➔ Mercury- Mercury has reared its ugly head and OEPA is getting calls weekly. If you suspect a mercury spill or have a confirmed spill please call the OEPA Spill Line 1-800-282-9398 and ask for the on-call EPA Coordinator to call you.

Currently the trend is Antique Clocks. The mercury is contained in the pendulum. When it spills it splatters. You cannot see all the mercury nor can you see the vapors. They advised that it will easily attach to turnout gear and in turn contaminate the gear, ambulance, fire truck and potentially the fire house if not properly removed. Visible Mercury will produce the most vapors.

OEPA is also reaching out to The Energy Security Agency for proper training on Lithium Batteries and Electric Cars. They are unsure how to deal with and dispose of them. The Fire Academy as well is looking into training for how to safely and effectively fight the fire. I have offered to host any training for our Region. They will have more information at our December HM TAC meeting.

We have a lot of upcoming training that Doug Witsken has worked hard to get. Please support any classes you can so we can continue to receive funds to host these great classes.

If you have any training needs or would like the Units at an Open House or Community Event please let us know at least 2 weeks in advance if possible.
